Breaking Bad News When breaking bad news, you should follow the SPIKES protocol (Baile et al 2000) SPIKES Protocol S - Setting Ensure you are in a comfortable confidential room where you will not be interrupted P - Perception Events that have led up to now Ask them what they already know/expect

Writing Tasks: Convey Good News and Bad News

good news Begin with the main idea or good news Provide details Close with a cordial comment, a reference to the good news, or a look toward the future Displeased Bad news messages; rejection letters Begin with a positive but relevant statement that allows for a transition into the bad news Give reasons for the negative answer Give the

EVIDENCE FROM THE LITERATURE AND RECOMMENDED STEPS

The importance of the breaking bad news interaction cannot be overlooked, and research has highlighted that the way health professionals approach this encounter can have a significant impact on the patient’s adjustment and functioning (Level IVa)^{2,3} The way in which diagnostic news is

delivered affects not only the person's understanding

Compassionate conversations

Communicate: Break bad news with compassion and kindness "I am very sorry to tell you X has died" "I have reviewed X with my team and sadly know ICU will not benefit them in any way We know we cannot save X's life/help to return them to a meaningful quality of ...
