Does Race Matter for Grandparent-Grandchild Relationships ...

grandchild relationships are beneficial to children's wellbeing across the life course For example, the grandparent-grandchild bond provides a unique source of love and support that fosters social immunity for the child, which cannot be gained from any other source (Kornhaber & Woodward, 1981)
